**Grade Level:** 8<sup>th</sup> Grade

**Lesson Title:** Online Enticement Can Lead to Sex Trafficking

**Instructional Time Required:** One Class Session

**Lesson Objectives:** Students should be able to:

- Understand the connection between online enticement and human trafficking.
- Identify what risk factors make a teen vulnerable to being trafficked.
- Explain what human trafficking is.
- Identify the various ways someone may be trafficked.
- Understand the difference between human smuggling and human trafficking.

**Lesson Overview:**

This lesson starts with listing statistics on human trafficking to highlight the severity of the crime to students and then draw the connection between online enticement and human trafficking. Students will watch a video called “What is Human Trafficking?” created by the Department of Homeland Security Blue Campaign. This video gives an introduction into human trafficking to educate students on what the crime is, where it happens, and how it tends to occur. It is important to ensure students understand the difference between human smuggling and human trafficking, as a clear distinction is made in this video. Students will learn about the risk factors and vulnerabilities that may make someone susceptible to being trafficked. Students will watch a four-part video series called “Mia’s Story” created by the Department of Homeland Security Blue Campaign. This video shows a young girl who is vulnerable, falls in love with an older guy who grooms her, and then gets trafficked by him. It’s important to engage the students thoroughly in a discussion following this video so that students can share their thoughts and understanding of the material presented in the videos.

**Key Terms in Lesson:**

Grooming- the process in which an offender sexually abuses a minor. This is often the first step in fostering a relationship with them and building trust.

Human smuggling- the illegal movement of someone across a border.

Human trafficking- modern day slavery; the illegal exploitation of a person through force, fraud, or coercion.

Online enticement- involves an individual communicating with a minor on the internet with the intent to commit a sexual offense or abduction.

- 2.3.8.PS.4: Describe strategies that sex traffickers/exploiters employ to recruit youth.
